
REGISTER REGULATION

CERTIFIED SECURITY PROFILER (CSP)



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1 Introduction

The Certified Security Profiler register has been moved to the Centre of Experts (COE BV) on request from OrcaSecure BV as of 1 January 2021.

The COE BV operates independently from OrcaSecure's organizational framework. People in this register can use CSP (Certified Security Profiler) after their surname as validation.

1.1 OBJECTIVE

This register is for individuals skilled in Proactive Security to be listed as experts.

The (public) register can be consulted by individuals, institutions, organisations and/or companies in need of expertise in this field.

People can also choose to be listed in a private register. This can be requested by the individual or their employer. This means their personal information stays private and can't be accessed by others without their permission. In this case, the COE BV registration will include a Non-public Registration (NoR). The rules and rights in these regulations still apply fully.

1.2 WORKING EXPERIENCE

To become a Certified Security Profiler, you must meet one of these criteria:

- a. You need both the Proactive Security Theory and Practical diplomas, granting the Certified Security Profiler title.
- b. Hold the Proactive Security Theory diploma and complete a relevant Security Management internship or graduation assignment, assessed with at least a 6.
- c. Individuals teaching Proactive Security with proven work experience are exempt from these requirements while they are actively teaching.

2 RIGHTS AND OBLIGATIONS CSP REGISTERED

2.1 RIGHTS CSP REGISTERED

The registered is entitled to use the title/brand name CSP¹ as proof of registration in the Certified Security Profiler register for a period of 3 years.

2.2 DUTIES CSP REGISTERED

Registrants must obtain **75 PE² points** per registration period (= 3 years).

PE points can be gained from the following activities:

- a. Structured form of education (see section 2.2.1);
- b. Other PE activities (see section 2.2.2);
- c. Actually work in the field of proactive security (see section 2.2.3).

2.2.1 Structured form of education

Structured forms of education means the:

- a. attend courses, trainings, e-learnings or other educational meetings relevant to the field of proactive security:
Per hour participated = 2 PE points
- b. Act as a speaker, lecturer, leader or developer of educational meetings relevant to the field:
Per hour = 5 PE points
- c. Act as a practical examiner at training courses related to the field of proactive security:
Per examination taken = 5 PE points
- d. Membership of professional committees, working groups, consultation platforms, etc: **Per membership per year³ = 5 PE points**
- e. Publish about the field in media in all its forms: (trade) journals, blogs, white papers, etc.
Per article of at least 1250 words = 15 PE points

2.2.2 Other PE activities

Other PE activities means the:

- a. participating in member meetings of trade unions:
At least 1 day part⁴ per meeting = 5 PE points
- b. attending seminars and conferences⁵ relevant to maintaining professional knowledge:
Per half-day session at the seminar/conference = 5 PE points
- c. Performance of (security) audits/surveys, advisory assignments requiring deployment of specialist knowledge:
Per assignment = 10 PE points

2.2.3 Working in the field of Proactive Security

- a. The registered is working full-time in the field with the position of Security Profiler as a main or secondary job:
Per calendar year = 15 PE points

2.2.4 CSP Audit

- a. The registered undergoes an audit at the request of the registered, demonstrating that registered is implementing the proactive security concept.
- b. The audit includes the following topics
 - a. Threat analysis
 - b. Proactive security policy
 - c. SOPs
 - d. Threat registration
 - e. Red Teaming exercises**Per registration period = maximum 75 PE points**

3 PRESENTATION OF DATA FROM THE CSP REGISTER

3.1 PUBLIC REGISTER

The following will be posted on the COE website: www.centreofexperts.nl in the publicly accessible register:

- surname;
- initials;
- prefix, academic title (limited to: bc, BA, BSc, MBA, MSc, MA, ir., ing., mr., drs, Dr) and,
- any suffixes;

3.2 NON-PUBLIC REGISTER (NOR)

The data mentioned earlier will be stored offline and accessed only through a secure process.

4 FINAL PROVISIONS

The registrant must keep the information in the registers up-to-date, accurate, and complete. If unsure, they should contact COE BV directly.

Registrants cannot claim compensation for any damage that occurs or might occur due to changes in these regulations.

COE BV makes all decisions on register matters not covered by these regulations and will provide reasons for their decisions.
